

Village of Roseville
Regular Meeting
April 6, 2026

The regular meeting was called to order at 6:01pm by Trustee McCullough in President Taflinger's absence. Trustees present included Casteel, Gooding, and Lybarger. Trustees Kirby and Barry were absent. Also in attendance were Treasurer Cindy Adkisson, Water superintendent Tony Carlson and Attorney Andrew Youngquist.

Motion to approve the agenda as presented was made by Casteel, 2nd by Gooding, motion carried.

A motion to approve the March 2, 2026 minutes as read was made by Gooding, 2nd by Casteel, motion carried.

A motion to approve the treasurer's report as presented was made by Lybarger, 2nd by Gooding, motion carried. Adkisson reported she will be renewing 3 CDs for 12 months each at a rate of 3.26%. She also read a letter from the State Gaming board stating the village has been overpaid due to the upgrade of the system and they will be withholding \$359.16 with the next payment to correct the issue.

In public forum, trustee Lybarger stated she has been approached regarding the residence at 435 N. Chamberlain having garbage stacked in front of the house and on the porch. She was requesting the proper way to handle this. Water Superintendent Carlson volunteered to speak to the resident at that address and if he is unsuccessful, Attorney Youngquist will pursue a letter of abatement.

Attorney Youngquist reported he is in the process of rescheduling the Mustread court date and that the Dix court date has been set for May 6th. If the property is cleaned up before the court date, Youngquist will cancel the court date.

Youngquist also stated he will be publishing the request for bids for the lot at 165 E. Broadway over the next 3 weeks and bids will be opened at the May 4th meeting.

Cherilyn Thomas spoke to the board about the community garden proposal. She provided the village with proof of liability insurance. After questions and discussion, Gooding moved to approve the project with a 2nd by Casteel. The motion carried. Thomas explained that the committee will build the 7 ½ foot fence, provide the equipment and install the drip irrigation system. The spigot on the east side of the community center will be the source of water. Carlson will install a meter on that spigot to determine the amount of water used for billing purposes. Youngquist will review the Host site agreement between the village and the Giving Gardens organization and will have an updated agreement ready to sign by the May meeting.

John Kennedy with WIAR spoke to the board about the new TNR (trap, neuter, return) program that was implemented within the county in December of 2025. The program is designed to help control the cat population by neutering, vaccinating and ear tagging stray cats. Residents wanting to participate will be able to get traps from WIAR, set them, retrieve the cat, take it to the vet, and then collect the cat and return it to the area. Fees will be paid by a combination of WIAR funds, vet participation, and donations from the county, donations from members of the communities and any other organization willing to help. Mr Kennedy stated they would be appreciative of donations or volunteers.

Dave Schonfelder spoke to the board about the State Champ Tulip tree in Eldridge Park. The board

will check with the Lions club and the legion about coordinating a plan to recognize the tree while it is in bloom over the next 4 to 6 weeks.

Casteel moved to accept the mowing bids from Jared Dace for the Community Center, \$40 per mowing, the park for \$160 per mowing and the legion, \$25 per mowing with \$15/hr. charge for extra cleanup as needed. 2nd by Lybarger. Call Vote: Casteel-yes, Gooding-yes, Lybarger-yes, McCullough-yes. Motion carried.

Gooding moved to transfer \$20,000 from general interest bearing to general checking, \$20,000 from water/sewer interest bearing to water/sewer checking and \$3000 from MFT interest bearing to MFT checking to pay April bills. 2nd by McCullough. Call vote: Gooding-yes, Lybarger-yes, McCullough-yes, Casteel-yes. Motion carried.

McCullough moved to approve the April bills for payment. 2nd by Lybarger. Call vote: Lybarger-yes, McCullough-yes, Casteel-yes, Gooding-yes. Motion carried.

Youngquist stated he has the draft of the grocery tax ordinance ready for presentation at the May meeting. This will allow the village to continue to charge a 1% tax on groceries even though the state has eliminated that tax.

Water superintendent Carlson requested permission to have Cory Babcock take down the 6 dying trees at the pump house and one at the community center for approximately \$500. The board agreed to remove the trees.

Gooding moved to adjourn, 2nd by Casteel. Motion carried.
